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#### Technical Notes

The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous month's data is subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2024 benchmark.

# Explanation of Terms and Concepts

#### Monthly Business

#### **Survey of Employers**

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry information on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bu-reau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, fullor part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th of the month. Approximately

5,000 Arkansas business establishments are surveyed.

#### <u>Metropolitan</u>

#### **Statistical Areas**

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

#### **Current Population**

#### Survey (CPS)

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 1,200 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

#### **Civilian Labor Force**

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

#### **Employment**

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

#### Unemployment

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

#### **Unemployment**

#### <u>Rate</u>

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates are calculated from unrounded data.

#### <u>Seasonal</u>

#### <u>Adjustment</u>

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, schedule shifts, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.

# A Comparative Look at Unemployment Rates

Between April and May, seasonally adjusted unemployment rates remained stable in 45 states and the District of Columbia. Three states posted a jobless rate increase, while two states declined. In May, unemployment rates ranged from a low of 1.8% in South Dakota to a high of 5.9% in the District of Columbia. Arkansas ranked 21st among states, with a jobless rate of 3.7%. Thirty-six states, including Arkansas, posted jobless rates at or below the national rate of 4.2%.

Compared to May 2024, unemployment rates have increased in 24 states and the District of Columbia. Four states posted jobless rate declines, while 22 states were statistically unchanged over-the-year. Arkansas' unemployment rate is up three-tenths of a percentage point, from 3.4% in May 2024 to 3.7% in May 2025.

# **Civilian Labor Force Summary**

The Arkansas Department of Commerce, in conjunction with the Bureau of Labor Statistics, announced Arkansas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained stable at 3.7% between April and May. At 4.2%, the United States' jobless rate was also unchanged.

Arkansas' civilian labor force increased by 615 in May, with 658 more employed Arkansans. The State remains at record high civilian labor force and employment levels. The small changes between April and May were not enough to impact the unemployment rate, which remains at 3.7% for a third consecutive month.


Compared to May 2024, employment in Arkansas rose by 12,386. There are currently 4,701 more unemployed Arkansans actively seeking work. Both added to the size of the civilian labor force, pushing the labor force participation rate up two-tenths of a percentage point over the year.




#### Monthly Job Gains/Losses by Major Industry Sector








#### **Memphis MSA - Employment**

# **County Labor Force Summary**


Between April and May, unemployment rates increased in 68 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Rates in four counties were unchanged, while three counties posted rate declines over the month. Jobless rates ranged from a low of 2.7% in Benton County to a high of 6.6% in Desha County.

In May, seven counties reported unemployment rates at or below 3%. That is down from eleven counties at or below 3% last month. For a third month in a row, no county had a jobless rate above seven percent.

Compared to May 2024, unemployment rates are up in 58 Arkansas counties. Eleven counties had the same rate as last May, while 6 counties were down over the year. Bradley and Monroe counties posted the largest annual increases, up 1.6% and 1.4%, respectively. The largest annual rate decline was in Polk County, down six-tenths of a percentage point.
